The General Duty Assistant or GDA program is designed to provide quality care to patients admitted in nursing homes and hospitals. Upon successful completion of the course, students become qualified to take the Healthcare Sector Skills Council (HSSC) competency exam and become certified GDAs and thus work in an efficient and knowledgeable manner.

THE JOB OF A GENERAL DUTY ASSISTANT

We all know that healthcare sector in india is growing rapidly and is experiencing an increase in demand for human resources across different verticals. That's exactly when professionals like General Duty Assistants are high in demand. Let's understand what it takes to be a General Duty Assistant working in a healthcare setting.

The Duties of a General Duty Assistant

General Duty Assistants, Commonly known as Nursing Care Assistants, Nursing Aides, Bedside Assistants or Orderlies are required to take care of patients' daily care, medication, safety and comfort. They are the ones who ensure and maintain a suitable environment for the patients during the recovery period. General Duty Assistants also make sure that the patients are fed with a healthy and well-balanced diet.

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Admission Procedure

Applications for admission are invited through the Gazetted admission notification in different leading national newspapers and reputed Publishers of the different states of India. Candidates may apply to the Institute Authority on application form Attached in Prospectus with duly attested Xerox Copy of relevant certificates along with Six colored Photographs for Entrance Examination & personal interview.

Depending upon the candidate's performance in written test and personal interview, short listed candidates are granted admission in their respective course strictly as per the merit list declared by the Examination Committee. Admission letter duly signed by the Principal/ Director will be sent at the respective addresses of the candidates in merit list. Students are then required to secure their admission within the prescribed date and time at the institute campus by depositing relevant fees through cash or demand draft. Admission granted as per norms of Board/ University.

Eligibility

Minimum qualification for securing admission to Certificate, Diploma & Degree Level Courses is 10+ & 10+ 2 Passed in any stream from recognized board.

Individual on the job provides patient care and help maintain a suitable environment. Some of the key responsibilities of the General Duty Assistant are to provide patient's daily care, patient's comfort, patient's safety and patient's health needs.

The Work Environment

The job of a General Duty assistant is not a typical desk job, neither do they have an option to work from home. However, you might find the job of a General Duty Assistant easy, as you do not have to handle team, rather you work as a part of a big team. Moreover, you may also be lucky to travel as part of your job.

The Working Hours

As far as the working hours are concerned, you can pick a shift as per your convenience. However, this varies from clinic to clinic.
